Sermon on the Mount

The preaching series for the Sermon on the Mount has now started, I believe that this is an important word not just to our local Church but to all Christians in what is now truly the Post Christian Era.

For the purpose of our study together we are looking at the Sermon in 7 sections with an introduction and summary giving 9 sessions as follows:

1. Introduction to Sermon on the Mount
2. Character - Matthew 5:3-12
3. Influence - Matthew 5:14-16
4. Righteousness - Matthew 5:17-48
5. Attitude - Matthew 6:1-18
6. Ambition - Matthew 6:19-34
7. Relationships - Matthew 7:1-20
8. Commitment - Matthew 21-27
9. Final Thoughts on the Sermon on the Mount

This Sunday, 26th July, we will be looking at what Jesus had to say about the way that Christian's should influence society.

What makes the Sermon on the Mount so important?

From the Early Church Fathers through the Reformation to the modern day hundreds maybe even thousands of book covering millions of pages have been written in an attempt to answer this question. I would like to offer two reasons that I think make the Sermon vitally important for the Church today and explain why it cannot be ignored:

1. The Sermon on the Mount is the Theology of Jesus
2. The Sermon on the Mount was the Theology of the Early Church

Theology of Jesus

To be effective in fulfilling the mission that God has given us we need to be building on the right foundation. Today we have more Theologies than we know what to do with in fact there is probably a Theology to cover every situation we can think of.

Achieving God's purpose means knowing His will and there is no greater demonstration of the will of God for a man or woman than the life of Jesus here on earth. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus articulates His Theology as He interprets the Word of God, the Law and the Prophets and tells His

followers how they are to apply the truth of God's Word in their daily lives.

To be effective the Church must abandon man made Theology and whole heartedly embrace the Theology of Jesus. The truth of this statement can be found in the second reason...

Theology of the Early Church

The early Church not only survived but it flourished in the Pre Christian Era. Just like the Post Christian Era that we now find ourselves in the Pre Christian Era was characterised by multiple faiths, moral decadence and pluralism. The parallels are clear and we ignore them at our peril.

The early Church was successful because they had a Theology that was relevant and that enabled the Church to engage with society at a practical level whilst standing apart spiritually and morally. It was a Theology that was transformational in both nature and effect. This Theology can be found in the Sermon on the Mount because the Theology of the Early Church was the Theology of Jesus and it is this Theology we need today.

Our Mission

If you take time to read the Mission Statement on the front of this newsletter you will see that the mission that we have adopted is identical to the mission that Jesus gave His Disciples (see Matthew 28:18-20).

So we find ourselves today with the same Mission as the Early Church facing the same challenges from society as they faced. The Theological response of many Christians today has been an attempt to transform their Theology to match the demands of society. They have a Transformed rather than Transformational Theology.

Studying the Sermon on the Mount offers us a chance to embrace the Theology of Jesus a Theology that will, if we let it, transform us as individuals and empower the Church to transform society. My prayer is that as we study together, we will be transformed.
